ABOUT THE KOLLEL

The Forest Hill Community Kollel is a vibrant and welcoming Torah learning centre where Jews of all ages and backgrounds can discover, explore, and engage with their Judaism.

Our Kollel is a dynamic institution combining two unique programs:

The core of the Kollel is our advanced Talmudic studies program, preparing and training the next generation of Jewish leaders.

Nine bright, talented, and enthusiastic young men dedicate their mornings and afternoons to intensive, high-level study of Talmud and Jewish Law. They attend weekly lectures on the curriculum, prepare and deliver their own presentations on complex Talmudic topics, and participate in Mussar Vaadim, interactive group sessions focused on personal and religious development. Our Kollel also prioritizes the study of Jewish thought, with a daily session on works of Machashava and Chassidus, and a weekly lecture from Rabbi Eliezer Breitowitz, Rosh Yeshiva of Darchei Torah.

Walk into the FHJC anytime of the day and you'll be greeted by the energetic and animated sounds of our Kollel scholars learning, debating, and arguing as they delve into the Talmud together.

In the evenings, the Kollel transforms into a centre for communal learning. Every night, our Kollel scholars are available for one-on-one and small group learning. We have study partners of all ages and backgrounds studying a variety of topics together, from Bible to Talmud, Jewish thought to Mishna, and more.

Since our founding in August 2023, we have seen an explosion of interest in one-on-one chavrusa study. Stop by nearly any night of the week and you'll find a full Beis Midrash!

Alongside our weekly chavrusas, the Kollel runs several classes and programs from men, women, and kids.

Our special Monday Night Learning events have been immensely successful. Over the course of the past 2 years, 30-50 men have joined us twice a month for small group learning with the Kollel scholars. We've addressed fascinating topics in Jewish law and thought, in addition to special pre-Yom Tov programs.

Last year marked the beginning of the Shira Herzog z"l Women's Scholars Program on Wednesday evenings. Over 70 women joined us over the course of three semesters for substantive and high-level Torah study taught by seasoned teachers. Our next semester will start in November 2025 with a brand-new series of intriguing and meaningful classes.

Thursday nights are a special event at the Kollel. The evening begins with Think Tank, a program for High-school students led by Rabbi Bernie Goldberg. An awesome group of intelligent and curious students from CHAT meet weekly to discuss big topics in Jewish thought and expand their Torah knowledge. Graduates of the program have gone on to continue their Jewish studies in Israel before attending university. The Kollel is then open for community learning and Rabbi YY Green's acclaimed Parsha shiur. The night ends with Beer & Cholent, the highlight of our week. We prepare for Shabbos with singing, Divrei Torah, and musical guests.

And finally, after a successful test-run last year, the Kollel is planning another series of Motzei Shabbos parent-child learning in the winter, complete with prizes, games, pizza, and engaging educational material.

With a variety of other weekly classes, seasonal events, and special lectures, the Kollel has transformed Jewish life in Forest Hill.

It has been amazing to see what the Kollel has accomplished over the past two years. The Kollel scholars, most of whom have been with us since the beginning, are developing into Talmidei Chachamim, honing their speaking and teaching skills, and continuing to engage and build meaningful relationships with our community.

And our community, in turn, has taken to the Kollel. More and more people are finding ways to connect to the Kollel and take advantage of the amazing opportunity it provides. No one regrets coming out on a weekday night to experience authentic Torah learning with like-minded Jews who want to engage with their faith and tradition.

As we enter our third year, please help us continue our mission to learn, teach, and spread Jewish knowledge. See you at the Kollel!


